CONGREGATIONAL MUSIC

DOCTRINALLY SOUND

It should align and complement what is preached and taught.

- "And Can It Be?"
 - He left His Father's throne above,
 - So free, so infinite His grace;
 - Emptied Himself of all but love,
 - And bled for Adam's helpless race;
 - 'Tis mercy all, immense and free;
 - For, O my God, it found out me.
- In the strictest, literal sense this phrase is not true.
- In a poetic sense it may be excusable.

FREE FROM WORLDLY ASSOCIATIONS

The text, tune, and style should not remind others of music that is not glorifying to God.

 - #I Country Song June 1975
 - You placed gold on my finger
 - You brought love like I've never known
 - You gave life to our children
 - And to me a reason to go on
 - You're my bread when I'm hungry
 - You're my shelter from troubled winds
 - You're my anchor in life's ocean
 - But most of all you're my best friend

 - With His Blood Jesus saved me
 - With a love like I've never known

ACCESSIBLE

The entire congregation, from toddler to senior, should be able to sing and comprehend the song.

RECONCILING: Assurance of Grace





SPECIAL MUSIC

Solos, groups, choirs, etc.

EVERYTHING ELSE, PLUS:

- The participants must be exemplary
- There is a broader range of appropriate music.
 - Next slide will go deeper...
- Music can be more advanced or technical.
- Avoid the temptation for novelty.


Hank Williams wrote and recorded "I Saw the Light"





Jack Williams Hayford (June 25, 1934 – January 8, 2023) was an American author, Pentecostal minister, and Chancellor Emeritus of The King's University (formerly The King's College and Seminary). He was formerly a senior pastor of The Church on the Way in Van Nuys, California, one of a handful of flagship churches in the Foursquare denomination, and was the fourth President of the International Church of the Foursquare Gospel. He was widely known for his involvement in the Promise Keepers movement and for being a prolific author and songwriter, with over 600 hymns and choruses in his catalog. He is the author of the popular 1978 hymn "Majesty", which is rated as one of the top 100 contemporary hymns and performed and sung in churches worldwide




WHO WROTE IT?

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

Offertories, preludes, postludes, etc.

INSTRUMENTALISTS

- You will have a limited pool of instrumentalists to choose from.
- Instrumentalists have limited competency and certain styles they will be more comfortable with.
- Be careful to not exceed the skill level of your musicians.

RECORDED MUSIC

- This is far more prevalent today thanks to technology.
- Live music is far superior to recorded music.
- Every church must make its own policy on when and what to use.
- The biggest drawback is that it draws attention to itself.
